This working list has been compiled by using, initially, Alfred B. Beaven's *The Aldermen of The City of London*, 2 vols. (1908--13), the city's manuscript Common Hall Book 10 (available for consultation at the London Metropolitan Archives), and the online *Oxford Dictionary of National Biography*. The surname spellings used are from Beaven and, where the names (usually those of non-aldermanic sheriffs) are not to be found in Beaven, from the Common Hall Book. The companies to which the various mayors and sheriffs belonged are from Beaven's main listings unless footnoted otherwise. The companies of a number of sheriffs have not yet been checked, where the sheriffs were not aldermen and so do not appear in Beaven; and this is noted in each listing concerned. They are likely, however, to be correct.

Stage Two has been partially done and involves confirming in a reliable MS or printed secondary source (e.g., a records-based company history) each sheriff's election and company not provided in both Beaven and the Common Hall Book and not already reliably confirmed elsewhere. The Common Hall Book has been footnoted as the source where Beaven does not provide the information, and Beaven is footnoted where the information does not come from his main listings. All company listings below have been confirmed if not specified as yet to be confirmed. Stage Two is scheduled for completion in early 2018. At a third stage, all of the list information will be added to the MASL database, once the database has been reprogrammed.
